- 1. Give sufficient notice when ordering - to ensure availability of your chosen Colourcrete product, a minimum notice period applies.
- 2. Site preparation is imperative; ensure your site is ready.
- 3. Consult your local council to determine environmental regulations for the disposal of waste.

Place

- 1. Safety first cement based products such as concrete have corrosive properties that may be harmful to the skin or eyes. Wear the appropriate PPE at all times.
- 2. Check product once the delivery arrives onsite, check that it is the correct product.
- 3. Don't add water -Colourcrete has been specially designed to achieve a unique look. Any addition of water to the concrete once it has arrived on site may result in an unsatisfactory finish and will reduce the strength of your concrete.

4. Use reputable contractors the placement and finish of the product, curing and protection is paramount to the end result. Hanson recommends that only reputable contractors be used to place and finish Colourcrete decorative range.

Care

- 1. Ensure bleed water is removed from surface after placement to avoid deposits called laitance causing temporary discolouration.
- 2. Protect seal the finished surface, don't use harmful chemicals. Maintain your concrete for a long lasting look.
